There are five basic areas

- of a child that need developing:

 1. The Physical—Since the body is the Temple of the Holy Ghost, that area needs
- attention and personal care.

 2. The Mental It is so vitally important that we work toward a positive outlook in a pessimistic and negative world.

 3. The Social — Certainly,
- we have a responsibility to teach righteousness and holy relationships in society.
 4. The Emotional — All of
- us understand the great need for balance in this area.
- 5. The Spiritual The inner man and his relationship to God.

In the public and government school system, attention to the spiritual is frowned upon. In many cases, it is outlawed.

One could not imagine the Jews coming out of Egypt Jews coming out of Egypt and through the wilderness; finally, entering into the Promise Land, fighting the battles, conquering the land, and then, turning their children over to the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Hivites, the Jebusites, the Amorites, and the Perizzites, to teach them of their false gods and worship of images and etc. images and etc.

WHAT IS REALLY AT STAKE IN THE 1976 ELECTIONS

In the early days of the Republic, economic issues were not apt to dominate political campaigns. Most men who ran for public office agreed with Thomas Jefferson that the country should have "a wise and frugal government" that should leave the people "free to regulate their own pursuits of industry and improvement" and "not take from the mouth of labor the bread it has earned.

But as more politicians became convinced that the Federal government should regulate the "pursuits of industry" and take the workingman's "bread"—both to support the bureaucracy and to redistribute that bread, presumably with greater "social justice" that that provided by the marketplace—economic questions have become crucial in politics.

This is especially true in Presidential and Congressional contests, because this is especially true in Presidential and Confessional contests, occase these shape our Federal government, the dominant political force intervening in our economy. In the 1976 campaigns, economic matters are the overriding issues, and they all give rise to a single question: "Do we want to accelerate the mounting trend toward an American Welfare State and socialistic control of industry, or do we want to buttress our heritage of self-reliance, limited government and a free economy?"

Focusing on economic matters, the question becomes: "Do we want to risk a speedup of inflation and the destruction of our currency by boosting government deficit spending and hampering savings and production or are we really determined to cut Federal expenditures, curb the growth of the money supply and thus preserve our currency and economy?"

supply and thus preserve our currency and economy?"

Most voters will not ask these questions because so few politicians raise them. The candidates know the words "socialism" and "welfare state" are abhorrent to Americans, so they do not use them, even when advocating measures which could properly be described by these terms. Politicians also know that Americans like "conservative rheoric," so they may make glowing references to the Constitution, free enterprise and unselfish citizenship, even though their proposals move in contrary directions.

In 1976, office seekers also know that many voters realize that increased Federal spending, without corresponding increases in taxation, will increase inflation, and that this can lead to recession and more unemployment. Even The New York Times — no advocate of fiscal conservatism — has acknowledged that "the underlying state of the economy four or five years from now — how much inflation, how high the rate of interest, the sufficiency of capital formation for new investment — is likely to depend more than anything else on the magnitude of the Federal budget."

And so those politicians whose actual policies and programs would oblige a significantly larger Federal budget are apt to camouflage this fact. They avoid mentioning specific costs, tell us that more taxes can be raised from the wealthy or big corporations, or suggest that their management competence can trim the cost of the Federal bureaucracy.

can trim the cost of the Federal bureaucracy.

But, all major Federal social programs have proven vastly more costly than their proponents originally envisioned and a broad cross section of the people have had to pay for them, in taxes and inflation. Taxing the wealthy more would not raise substantial revenue and would decrease their productive contributions. Increasing taxes on corporations would only diminish their ability to create jobs. And every attempt to curtail the cost of the Federal government with organizational procedures—but without cutting the dollars spent on social programs—has failed.

Some candidates, while professing frugality, urge greater Federal spending on education, transportation, the cities, welfare, health, housing, the environment, Social Security, and job creation! Such office seekers contradict

The thoughtful voter should also assess the candidates in terms of their soundness regarding these major economic issues:

1. Unemployment. Many politicians say coping with unemployment is their top economic priority. They put it ahead of checking inflation and imply that private enterprise has failed to generate jobs, hence government must See Page 4

I. BECAUSE OF THE DRIFT AWAY FROM GOD, THE BIBLE, AND EVERYTHING THAT CHRISTIANS COUNT PRECIOUS.

Jesus said, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth every word that proceeded out of the mouth of God". (Matthew 4:4)

There was a time in America when the law required that children memorized the Lord's Prayer and the Ten Commandments. It was required that teachers have daily Bible reading and public praying. Now, that same law forbids all of these things. The first nine colleges organized in America were church sonosored with the

church sponsored, with the exception of one. Harvard in 1636, William and Mary in 1693, Yale in 1701, Princeton in 1743, Columbia in 1754, Brown in 1765, Rutgers in 1766, and Dartmouth in 1769. The one exception was the University of Pennsylvania

in 1755. These first eight were opened for the sole purpose of training young men for the ministry. Now, of course, all of these have been stolen by the secular society, and it frowns upon the very frowns upon the very principles for which it was

founded.

Schools have gone from religious sponsored to non-religious, and then to anti-religious. They have passed through various stages from Godly, to non-Godly, then to un-Godly, and finally, to anti-Godly. Since 72 percent of state



Their philosophy teaches that pre-marital sex and extra-marital sex is perfectly all right; that people who have a desire to live on the extra-marital sex. abnormal sex or perversion, such as homo-sexuality and lesbianism, should be just as welcome in our society as anyone else. Two years ago, there was over \$500,000,000 worth of damage in government schools in America. It is predicted that this year, the figure will be \$600,000,000. Ask any administrator of a Christian Day School what their vandalism and property damage figure is, and without exception, you can almost mark it down — ZERO! In the public schools last year, there were 100 murders by student vandals; 12,000 armed robberies, 270,000 burglaries, and 9,000 270,000 burgiaries, and 9,000 rapes occurred. Some schools have become public battlefields. One person referred to the public school system as the reign of schoolhouse terror. Paul Harvey, in a recent article pointing out the drift of pointing out the drift of crime and destruction, emphasized that the public schools had to accept the responsibility for not doing anything to counteract it. The crime bill in America this past year was \$27,000,000,000. There's a fatal shooting every thirty minutes; a rape every twenty-six minutes; a and in Kentucky this past month, there were more divorces than weddings! It seems to get worse every year. While the federal government pours millions of dollars into crime prevention and studies, it

prevention and studies, it continues to happen. It is surely true that the "God of this world has blinded the minds of them that know him not".

Proposed IRS Regulations

On February 11, 1976, the Internal Revenue Service published proposed regulations defining auxiliary agencies of churches. Under the Internal Revenue Code, any church agency which is considered to be an "integrated auxiliary" of the sponsoring church is not required to file annual information returns (Form 990) with the Internal Revenue Service.

Since the enactment of tax reform legislation in 1969, most church-affiliated Christian day schools have understood that they were exempted by Congress from filing annual information

The proposed regulations published by the Service would exclude church-affiliated Christian day schools, homes for the aged, and orphanages from the definition of church auxiliaries. Such agencies would be required to file annual information returns with the Internal Revenue Service, and would be subject to audit by a revenue

agent.
The publication of the proposed regulations has sparked a storm of protest by a large number of church groups. More than 90 written protests were submitted to the Internal Revenue Ser-vice objecting to its position.

At a hearing held on June

7. 1976, attended by Internal Revenue Commissioner Donald C. Alexander and several high - level assistants, more than 14 speakers testified against the proposed regulations. the proposed regulations.

Among those presenting testimony were Dr. Al C.

Janney, President of the American Association of Christian Schools, Dr. Paul A. Kienel of the Western Association of Christian Schools and John Mosan ASSOCIATION OF Christian Schools, and John C. Macon, President of the Eastern Association of Christian Schools. Spokesman for various denominational groups also expressed strong gpposition to the Internal Revenue Service's position The Eastern Association of

The Eastern Association of Christian Schools engaged Chevy Chase, Maryland tax attorney Paul Chappell to prepare and file a brief in objection to the proposed Internal Revenue Service regulations. This brief calls attention to certain technical and practical problems of which the drafters of the proposed regulations ap-

proposed regulations apparently were not aware.

true story. Was the woman within her rights in refusing admittance to the authorities? If you don't know, you should. I am reminded of the Apostle Paul who took full advantage of who took this dights as a Roman citizen. When he was scourged and bound he asked, "Is it lawful for you to scourge a man that is a Roman and uncondemned?" When he received an unfair trial by Festus, he appealed to Ceasar. Paul knew the law and did not consider it "unchristian" to stand up for

his rights as a citizen. The housewife in the above story is my wife and the incident took place about five years ago. The men did call me at work about a week later and told me that there was a slight misun-derstanding and wanted to know when they could come over and inspect our house. I over and inspect our house. I naturally informed them that there was not a misunderstanding. "You asked to come in and you were told no; that seems very easy to understand." I did offer to answer any questions which they might like to ask me over the phone and then prepared for a lengthy barage of questions. lengthy barage of questions. I was amazed to discover that three or four questions were all they asked. They were brief but certainly not unimportant questions.
"How many bathrooms do now many Dathrooms do you have in your home?" "Are the bathrooms car-peted?" "Do you have paneling or sheetrock on your walls?"

The interview was brief and to this day we haven't been bothered by the tax assessors office.

especially Christian educators, we need to know what our rights as citizens are. A government official must have a search warrant in order to invade your home without an invitation. The constitution gives Congress the power to take "head-count" in the nation. They do not have the power to force us to fill out the ridiculous census questionaires which were distributed in 1970.





But inflation produces unemployment—because it curbs consumer buying. But inflation produces unemployment—because it curbs consumer buying. Primarily, unemployment is the result of government intervention in raising wage rates above free market levels, through the minimum wage law and granting monopolistic and coercive privileges to labor unions. These interventions oblige employers to pay more than the less able workers' production can generate from customers, and thus make those workers unemployable.

Unemployment is increased by high corporate taxes, which leave companies with insufficient capital to create new jobs. Joblessness is aggravated by excessive payments to the unemployed. The closer such payments come to the after-tax incomes workers could earn, the more they deter people from

Removing these root causes of unemployment is the only sound solution. Removing these root causes of unemployment is the only sound solution. Government can create jobs for some only at the cost of increasing prices for everyone. "Public jobs" are apt to involve services which the public does not greatly value and are paid for at higher than marketplace wages. Long-run result: higher taxes, more inflation or both—not an increase in real wealth. Take away laws prohibiting employment and those subsidizing unemployment, and we can have "full employment" without increasing taxes or inflation!

2. Inflation. Politicians are likely to minimize this issue in 1976, since double-digit price rises have tapered and polls show the public is impressed by the favorable trend. But voters who realize that rising prices are due primarily to increases in the quantity of money (it was increased by an enormous \$56.3)

billion last year) understand that inflation remains an acute problem.

Unless taxes are raised, the present administration's deficits will have inflationary effects especially if the next administration is a big spender. The assertion that we can "slow inflation by increasing the productivity of business" has validity only if the right actions are taken—such as holding down excessive wage increases and trimming government spending and borrowing—thus making more capital available for private investment.

The notion that "price controls are not needed now but may be if inflation The notion that "price controls are not needed now but may be it initiation gets worse." flies in the face of history: such controls have never worked. They always decrease the supply, increase the demand and thus create shortages — which in turn generate higher prices.

3. Tax Reform. To the typical voter "closing tax loopholes" implies the loopholes enjoyed by someone else. If we systematically tied up every conceivable loophole, we would increase everybody's taxes and throttle incentive.

- As economist Ludwig von Mises said: "This is loophole capitalism. If you close all the loopholes, you close down Capitalism." The only successful tax reform would be a general reduction in taxes, but this can be done only if we reduce government spending.
- 4. Minimum Wage. Often, politicians who want to increase employment also want to increase the minimum wage. Their policies are contradictory. Boosting the minimum wage will increase unemployment, especially among teenagers and minorities. Minimum wage policies keep the least qualified from getting a grip on the bottom rung of the job ladder—and in turn prevent them from working their way up to increased responsibilities and higher
- wages.

 5. Job Rights. Surprisingly, some who view themselves as friends of the working man would deny him the right to work unless he joins a union. Such politicians support repeal of section 14-B of the Taft-Hartley Act which allows states to legislate open shops. If repealed, it would grant more monopoly power for unions, less freedom for workers.

 Some candidates also support the "right" of construction unions to picket an entire job site—shut down a complete project, picket on public property and harm innocent parties—in the effort to force employers into submission.

Some also want to assure government employees of the "right to collective argaining," which has been called "the right to collective bludgeoning," pargaining," which has been called "the right to collective bludgeoning," since the employees almost always win. Doesn't the nature of a government employee's work suggest a voluntary agreement to remain on the job in service to the public? Can government perform its functions reliably if its employees—including policemen, firemen and members of the armed forces—have the right to strike?

6. Welfare. In this campaign many urge an income-maintenance program o. Wetrare. In this campaign many urge an income-maintenance program "substantially" financed by the Federal government to provide a minimum income for the "working poor" and those unable to work. This would mean a guaranteed annual income. In some states—the poorer ones—the Federal government is already paying 75% of welfare costs.

Somehow, people assume that if cost of welfare is transferred to the Federal government "nobody will have to pay for it." This is a device to hide the cost of welfare or to get others to pay for it, or to increase welfare levels. It may also increase the number of unemployed and decrease productivity. Human nature is powerfully inclined to ask: "Why work if you don't have to?" "Why work any harder than necessary?"

WHETHER YOU KNOW IT OR NOT-YOU AND YOUR FAMILY **ARE \$45,000 IN DEBT!**

Thomas Jefferson, the man who wrote the Declaration of Independence, said: "I place economy among the first and most important virtues, and public debt as the greatest danger to be feared.

Jefferson's counsel, as wise today as it was 200 years ago, has long been ignored. Because our government has insisted on spending more than it collected in taxes, each of the last five Presidents has doubled his predecessor's deficit.

Franklin Roosevelt, father of the New Deal, was considered a big spender; but in eight years Truman increased the Roosevelt deficit by about \$11/2 billion. Eisenhower was expected to be "fiscally responsible," but in eight years he multiplied the Truman deficit nearly ten times by about \$151/2 billion. Kennedy, in just two-and-a-half years, spent more than Eisenhower did in eight, incurring a \$17 billion deficit.

Then Johnson, who believed we could finance both the Vietnam war and "The Great Society"without increasing taxes, doubled the Kennedy deficit. The Johnson deficit was \$36 billion. Nixon, who promised to balance the budget, ended up doubling the Johnson deficit. Nixon's deficit was some \$70 billion.

Gerald Ford, in his first two years increased the deficit about \$130 billion-more than all five previous Presidents combined. The federal debt is expected to reach \$636 billion by the end of 1976.

Not only our federal government but our state and local governments have gone deeper into debt. So have private companies and individuals-because they have largely abandoned the philosophy of thrift. Today we face a total public and private debt of more than \$3 trillion-about \$45,000 per family.

Some would dismiss this huge sum with the cliché that "we only owe it to ourselves"; but the total is made up of specific debtors and creditors, and each of us must pay the costs of servicing these debts.

Interest paid on the combined federal, state and local debt jumped from a "mere' \$196 million in 1913 to a huge \$41.8 billion in 1975. Interest paid on consumer and unincorporated business debt rose from \$2.0 billion in 1950 to \$65.5 billion in 1975.

Because corporate taxes are so high, and wage rates have been forced above free market levels by monopolistic unions, companies have not been able to generate adequate capital from profits, and have been forced to borrow heavily in the capital markets. In turn, interest payments by corporations mushroomed from \$3.2 billion in 1950 to \$126.5 billion in 1975.

Since it is the people who directly or indirectly pay the interest on all debt, it is instructive to compare the total interest paid on personal, corporate and public debt to personal income. Interest payments on all government and private debt rose from \$11.6 billion in 1950 to a huge \$233.8 billion in 1975—from 5.1% of personal income to 18.8%.

As economist Wesley H. Hillendahl has said, the burden of debt-felt by individual Americans in the cost of interest-erodes consumers' purchasing power just as inflation does.

Isn't that a good reason for America to start putting her fiscal house in order?



"While we can fully understand your motivation in making an effort to reach all of the people concerning your beliefs and we know that your intention is of the highest caliber, we cannot and will not allow literature such as was given to me today that apparently you had passed throughout the Hospital."

This literature which Mirmak went on to say would "create more problems for the patients than we could wish," turned out to be two Gospel tracts written by the late Oliver B. Greene. The point of the matter, however, is not who wrote the tracts or what they contained. That which disturbs us most is the unwhich constitutional assumption that Christians do not have the right to witness for Christ in a public hospital where folks are suffering and

I appreciated so much Reverend McKnight's reply to Mr. Mirmak and I wish we had space to reprint the letter in its entirety. His closing remarks sum up the heart of his response:

"This is America, not Russia. Must we again throw Christians to the because their beliefs are objectionable? The golden truth that it has taken the free world 1800 years to learn is that a

man's right to his own religious convictions and to impart them to others are as sacred in the eves of the law as his rights of person and property, and although in the minority, he shall be protected in the full and protected in the full and unrestricted enjoyment thereof. (Condensed from a recent Ohio Supreme Court decision.)"

The threat to religious liberty by the Administrator of Santa Rosa Hospital in Milton, Florida was even more blatantly blunt. The Office of Administrator John Rauch issued the decree that religious solicitation of any kind was prohibited. One lady was ordered to remove a religious pin she was wearing. Religious literature wearing, Rengious interature of any kind was not to be tolerated. Thankfully the good people of Santa Rosa County would not succumb to such injustice and Mr. Rauch resigned under pressure.

7. Health. Among the most costly new programs being proposed is national health insurance with universal and mandatory coverage. Such a coercive program is a feature of the British Welfare State, which many Americans seem determined to emulate, despite its failure. England found that a national health program, because it lowers the market price of health services, greatly intercent the forward. increases the demand. As demand goes up, so do costs.

At the same time, it reduces medical practice from a highly personal art to a form of government bureaucracy, where doctors and surgeons are tied up in red tape. Rev. Clifford Oden is living proof that cancer can be controlled by natural means-without surgery, without radiation, without chemotherapy. For seven years, Rev. Oden has had cancer-and has kept it under control. He credits vitamin B-17 and other substances that God put in nature.

"Thank God I have cancer?" Rev. Oden means it. When he first learned that he was stricken, his doctor recommended conventional treatment. Rev. Oden, as shattered as anyone would be at the bad news, turned to God in prayer. He asked the Lord to show him why He had stricken him . . . how he might cope -and help others to cope. By all appearances, his prayers were answered. He wrote this book to "strengthen the faith of the believer" and to show him that God is at work in the cancer field.

No friend of the medical (or religious) establishment, Rev. Oden espouses the trophoblast theory-not one favored by most medical authorities. This theory holds that the cancer cell is not caused by a virus but is a normal part of the body: the same cell that is active during pregnancy. Rev. Oden therefore reasons that if God made man with cells that could produce cancer, He also gave man natural means to control these cells. Rev. Oden describes these substances-the very ones he has utilized to keep his cancer in check.

This book, then, is more than the story of one man's brave and so far successful fight against a killer. It is rich in practical advice: foods and natural substances that Rev. Oden has found helpful; an early detection test for cancer; a list of doctors who find merit in B-17 and metabolic therapy; and a recommended reading list.

This does not purport to be a book of medical science. But until medicine gives us the definitive cancer cure, Rev. Oden's story deserves to be pondered: by doctors, and by laymen.

Rev. Clifford Oden is currently serving as Associate Pastor of the Jupiter Road Baptist Church in Garland, Texas. He has previously been pastor of Baptist churches in Longview and Dallas, Texas, and dean of Garland College. He has a B.A. from Howard Payne College, an M.S. from East Texas Baptist College, and an LL.D. from Garland College. He and his wife Louise have four children: three sons and one daughter.
